

This is a compilation of the most frequently asked questions we've received surrounding the recent [legislative changes](#) to [HRS §134](#). This list will be updated periodically. - **If an applicant submits their CCW application in 2023, and it is approved in 2024, how long will it be valid for once issued?**
  - 2023 CCW applications issued in 2024 will be subject to 2023 rules. Approved licenses will be issued for 1 year. Upon expiration, 2024 rules for renewal will apply.
  
- **When an applicant submits their initial CCW app in 2024, they are charged the \$150 Non-Refundable App fee at the time of submission. When they're card is printed & ready to go, will there be any other fee's they must pay at the time of pick-up?**
  - No other fees will apply.
  
- **If a 2024 licensee wants to 'add' a firearm to carry under that license, what paperwork do they need to submit and will there be a fee associated with adding a firearm?**
  - applicants adding a firearm to an existing license, or applying for a CCW to include more than one firearm must submit the required proficiency certification for each firearm to be carried. No additional fees apply. Licensees will need to renew their proficiency qualifications for each firearm he/she intends to carry every 4 years.
  
- **In 2024, will applicants have to pay the \$150 CCW application fee for each firearm they add to their CCW license?**
  - No. The one-time (per county) \$150 application fee will cover all firearms authorized under the license. Upon expiration of the license (after 4 years), a renewal fee of \$50 will apply.
  
- **How can a 2024 Licensee renew his/her CCW license?**
  - 2024 Licensees must submit a CCW renewal application (available online soon) no more than 90 days prior and no less than 30 days prior to the expiration of their initial CCW license issued under 2024 rules. A \$50 renewal

- **What is the process to replace a lost, stolen, or destroyed CCW license card?**
  - Licensees shall report lost, stolen, or destroyed CCW card to a police officer within 24 hours of the loss. Once documented by police, contact the MPD Firearms Unit to advise them of the loss. A replacement license card will be issued asap upon verification of the police report. No fee is associated.
  
- **Will MPD accept CCW applications if the applicant obtained his/her firearm qualification from an outer-island firearms instructor not yet approved by Maui's Chief?**
  - Per HRS §134, Maui County applicants submitting a CCW application must obtain firearm qualifications from a Maui County Qualified Firearms Instructor. Qualified Firearm Instructor Applications are available at MauiPolice.Com
